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## Plumas County Sheriff's Office Alternative Custody Supervision

### I. Purpose:

- A. To provide Alternative Custody Supervision programs to Plumas County Jail inmates in lieu of physical confinement.
- B. Alternative Custody Supervision will be used as a Classification tool to assist in jail population management.

### II. Policy:

- A. The Alternative Custody Supervision Program will adhere to California Penal Code Sections 1203.017, 1203.016 and 1203.018 and all other applicable laws.
- B. The Alternative Custody Supervision staff will actively assess all sentenced inmates to see if they are eligible for Alternative Custody Supervision and, if so, ability to pay will not be cause for denial.
- C. The ACS Sergeant will use the Static Risk and Offender Need Guide (STRONG) assessment tool to objectively screen all sentenced inmates and determine eligibility for the Alternative Custody Supervision. The overriding factors will be public safety and judicial concerns.
- D. The Jail Commander shall have sole discretionary authority to permit program participation.

### III. Definitions:

- A. Jail Commander: Sheriff's designee.
- B. Static Risk and Offender Need Guide (STRONG): A screening instrument designed to identify lifestyle criminality. This is a validated tool to establish level of risk and appropriate custodial security.
- C. ACS: Alternative Custody Supervision.

### IV. Procedure:

- A. Screening Process for Alternative Custody Supervision



1. There are three ways to be considered for the Alternative Custody Supervision:
  - a. The person may request to be assessed for suitability for the program;
  - b. The person is selected through the automatic screening process; or
  - c. The court may recommend or refer the person.

B. Screening Process

1. When people are convicted and sentenced to county jail or county prison they will be assessed by the Alternative Custody Supervision staff for eligibility for participation in Alternative Custody Supervision.

C. Eligibility

1. Eligibility will be based on:
  - a. Criminal history.
  - b. Disciplinary history while incarcerated
  - c. The inmate's ability to understand and comply with the home detention contract.
  - d. Residence must be in Plumas County

D. Inmates Who Are Denied

1. Inmates who are denied will receive the specific reasons for the denial in writing. The written document will also include appeal rights.

E. Processing Appeals

1. Appeals must be based on an error or omission in the assessment process.
2. Inmates wishing to appeal their denial to the Alternative Custody Supervision program must fill out an inmate request form. On the form inmate must ask for a grievance form.
3. On the grievance form inmate must explain in detail why the denial was incorrect.



- a. The Jail Commander will review the grievance and review inmate file.
  - b. The Jail Commander will render a decision in writing and return it to the inmate.
4. If the inmate disagrees with the decision of the Jail Commander, they may make a final appeal to the Assistant Sheriff.

F. Rules and Regulations

1. The rules and regulations of the Alternative Custody Supervision are found in the inmate handbook.

G. Violations of the Rules and Regulations

1. Failure to comply with any of the rules and regulations in the contract could result in returning to custody.
2. Rules and regulations violations will be processed as outlined in the inmate discipline policy.
3. Failure to comply with program rules and regulations may also result in further criminal charges.

V. Staff Responsibilities

A. Home Detention Coordinator

1. The Alternative Custody Supervision Officer will be responsible to perform the following:
  - a. Gather information from the criminal history report, D.M.V. print out, pre-sentence report (if applicable),
  - b. Enter data on the assessment form and score the form;
  - c. Notify the inmate in writing of the results;
  - d. If inmate is denied:



- (1) Route the screening form to the classification file; and
    - (2) Route the written denial to the inmate.
  - e. If the inmate is approved:
    - (1) Complete the administrative paperwork:
    - (2) Meet with the inmate to review the aforementioned forms. Review the rules and regulations and sign the Alternative Custody Supervision Contract; and
    - (3) The completed file will be stored at the Plumas County Jail
2. The Alternative Custody Supervision Officer/Deputy will supervise inmates on the program. This will require them to perform the following functions:
  - a. Go to the home of the person and perform a search to ensure the requirements of the contract are met;
  - b. Set up the monitoring equipment and review daily reports;
  - c. Conduct random on-site supervision of the person at their home or work;
  - d. If reasonable cause exists that alcohol or narcotics have been used, collect urine or breath samples;
  - e. Upon the person's release, The Alternative Custody Supervision Officer/Deputy will remove the monitoring equipment and release them from custody;
  - f. When reasonable suspicion exists that the person has violated the contract, staff may re-take them into physical custody.
3. The Alternative Custody Supervision Officer/Deputy will also notify the Sheriff's Office and substation that a home detainee is present in their jurisdiction. Information to the agency will contain the following information:
  - a. Name;
  - b. Address;



c. Date of birth; and

d. Offense committed

B. Corrections Sergeant

1. The Corrections Sergeant will oversee and supervise the Alternative Custody Supervision.

## Alternative Custody Supervision

### Electronic Surveillance Program (ACS) Officer Duties

#### GENERAL

This position is staffed during the officer's scheduled working days and hours and may require the officer to respond to "call outs" that are of after hours or scheduled days off of work. A Correctional Sergeant shall be assigned to the duties of ACS Officer. The ACS Officer's general responsibilities are to assess, place, and monitor the activities of Plumas County Jail ACS inmates. These inmates may include approved transfers from another California law enforcement agency, and/or Plumas County Superior Court Pre Trial Own Recognizance inmates who have been approved for the ACS program.

Plumas County Superior Court remands onto the program for close supervision through the use of electronic monitoring device(s) to alleviate over-crowding inside the jail.

#### PRIMARY DUTIES

The primary duties of the ACS Officer may include, but are not limited to:

1. Be cognizant and carry out the department general orders and procedures.
2. Issue ACS applications to and interview applicants (incarcerated inmates, members of the public who are ordered by the court to turn themselves in on a specific date and time, or transfers from another California law enforcement agency) who are eligible for the program.
  - a. If an applicant wants to transfer to Plumas County from another California county, the ACS Officer will coordinate with that allied agency to ensure that the transfer can be made.
  - b. If an applicant wants to transfer from Plumas County to another California county, the ACS Officer will determine and confirm with that specific county to see if they accept out-of-county transfers.
    - i. If that county does not accept out-of-county transfers then the applicant may not transfer to that county.
    - ii. If that county does accept out-of-county transfers then the ACS Officer would follow the same procedure in placing someone on ACS in-county. Once that applicant has been approved for ACS in-county, the ACS Officer will coordinate with the prospective county to ensure that the transfer can be made.



3. Gather information (rap sheet, warrants check, pending court cases, etc.) on applicants in determining whether he/she is eligible.
4. Interview the victim(s) (if any) of the case in which an applicant is currently sentenced on, particularly to see if the victim(s) would have any objection to the applicant being placed on ACS.
5. Once an applicant has been approved for the program, the ACS Officer will go to the applicant's residence to install the electronic monitoring equipment. While at the residence, the ACS Officer will also do the following:
  - a. If alone, the officer will conduct a brief search of the residence (by having the applicant open doors and cabinets) for any contraband (ie, drugs, alcohol, prohibited weapons, explosives, and firearms).
  - b. If there is a back up unit present, the officer will conduct a thorough search of the residence for any contraband (ie, drugs, alcohol, prohibited weapons, explosives, and firearms).
6. Conduct routine ACS compliance checks on those placed on the program and enforce ACS rules.
7. Conduct random drug testing on those who are placed on the program by having them provide urine samples into a urine test cup.
8. Maintain constant telephone communication with individuals placed on ACS seven days a week.
9. In the event of a violation:
  - a. If an out-of-county transfer from another California county to Plumas County violates, the ACS Officer would retrieve the ACS equipment, instruct the transfer to report back to his/her respective agency, and notify the contact person in charge of the transfer. A supplemental jail disciplinary action report may be requested by the respective agency, which the ACS Officer would have to provide.
  - b. If an out-of-county transfer from Plumas County to another CA county violates, the ACS Officer would be notified by the respective agency, locate and bring the inmate back to jail, and complete a jail disciplinary action report.
10. In the event of an escape, the ACS Officer would make every effort available to retrieve the ACS equipment, investigate, and follow leads in order to locate the escapee and return them to jail. The ACS Officer will contact Dispatch and have a BOLO issued for the escapee if he/she cannot be located and brought back to jail, notify any allied agencies (if necessary), and complete a criminal report charging the escapee with escape and any other applicable charge(s).



## **SEDONDARY DUTIES**

The secondary duties of the ACS Officer may include, but are not limited to:

1. The ACS Officer is the Programs OIC (Officer In Charge) and assumes such duties in the absence of the Jail Commander.
2. Act as a back-up unit (if nearby) for the Patrol Division with the authorization from the on-duty Patrol supervisor.
3. Attend CEMA (California Electronic Monitoring Association) meetings and update ACS Staff and Jail Commander of any pertinent information.
4. Communicate with STOP LLC (contracted electronic monitoring company) for equipment and continuous monitoring of individuals on ACS.





## **Plumas County Sheriff's Office Alternative Custody Supervision ACS Officer Field Protocol**

The Alternative Custody Supervision Unit's purpose is to monitor inmates who have been screened, selected, and placed on the ACS program.

1. Officers will begin their shift by updating their ACS Contact Books
2. Officer(s) will then create their target list of inmates and locations which they will be contacting / searching.
  - a. Target lists will be sent to dispatch, the ACS Sergeant
3. Officers will go "10-8" when leaving the office/ substation to perform their checks.
4. Upon arrival at target location the officer will go "10-97" the numbered target location before exiting the vehicle, and wait for Plumas County Dispatch response.
5. Once radio traffic is confirmed the officer(s) will make contact with the inmate.
6. After initial contact, and when appropriate the officer(s) will notify dispatch that the target location is "Code 4"
7. Officer(s) will then conduct their search / contact updating dispatch as requested.
8. Officers will then go "10-8" and inform dispatch of their next numbered target location.





## **Plumas County Sheriff's Office Alternative Custody Supervision ACS Risk Assessment Status Review**

Inmates on the ACS program are eligible to have their Risk Assessment status reviewed after 60 days of being placed on the program. A memo will be generated and forwarded to the ACS Sergeant by the supervising officer reflecting the following:

- Inmates' Name and ID #
- Inmates' current supervision level
  - Reason for current supervision level (which section(s) of the Risk Assessment Scale scored them as High, Medium, Low.
- Date inmate was released to ACS program
- How many days was the inmates sentence
- Case number(s) and charge(s)
- Sentenced to county time or county prison
- Reason inmate should be downgraded or upgraded in supervision

These memos will be sent to the ACS Sergeant or Jail Commander for review. The memo will then be placed in the inmates file and logged into the Offender track system. The inmates' supervision status will then be changed in STOP LLC.





# Plumas County Sheriff's Office Alternative Custody Supervision

## Risk Assessment and Program Placement

1. Inmates who qualify may apply for and/or be given an ACS application and be instructed to fill out the application and return it to the Jail Staff.
2. Daily, the Line Staff will collect the applications and review that the information is completed. The inmates' application will then be forwarded to the ACS Officer(s)/designee for review.
  - a. The ACS Officer will calculate an "ACS Risk Assessment" of the incoming applications by utilizing the inmates' ACS application and Classification File to determine the "ACS Risk Assessment" total.
  - b. The "ACS Risk Assessment" procedure will be conducted as follows:
    - i. Upon receipt of an inmates' ACS application the ACS Officer will complete a Risk Assessment by using the inmates classification file to determine the inmates severity of current charges, offense history, as well as FTA's and failure to comply with condition of release in the past 3 years:
      1. If the inmate is not currently in custody the ACS Officer will have to electronically verify the criteria listed above.
    - ii. Using the inmates' ACS application the ACS Officer will complete the "Stability Factors" portion of the Risk Assessment and, following the flow chart, determine if the inmate falls into High, Medium, or Low supervision category.
      1. If inmates' risk assessment falls into the "Supervisor Approval" category, the Officer will bring the packet to the ACS Sergeant / Jail Commander for approval.
        - a. A written letter approving or denying the applicant will be placed in the inmates' file and logged into the Offendertrack system.



- iii. An ACS Officer will review the completed application and risk assessment before forwarding the packet to the ACS Sergeant.
  - iv. The ACS Sergeant will review the application and interview the inmate before the inmate is released to ACS from standard custody.
  - v. Once the inmate is transferred from standard custody to the ACS program the ACS Officer/Sergeant will activate and install the inmates' monitoring equipment, and set their schedule.
3. Each week the ACS Sergeant will audit the newly approved applications and risk assessments for accuracy and program continuity.

### ACS Risk Assessment Point Rating Scale

#### Residence

- 3 points Present Residence 1 year or more
- 2 points Present Residence 6 months and Prior total 1 year
- 1 point Present Residence 4 months for present and prior total 6 months
- 0 points Present Residence less than 4 months or present and prior less than 6 months or transient

#### Family/Community Ties

- 3 points Lives with family members  
(i.e. spouse, parent, grandparent, siblings, children, girlfriend/boyfriend for 2 years)
- 2 points Lives with a friend or alone and has regular contact with immediate family  
Lives with extended family (i.e. aunt, cousin, in-law)
- 1 point Lives with friend(s) or alone and has occasional contact with family (once a month)  
Lives with girlfriend/boyfriend for less than 2 years and has no other family contact
- 0 points Transient or lives alone with no family or close friend contact

#### Employment

- 3 points Currently employed and has been steadily employed full-time for the past year.  
Employment does not have to be with the same employer, but must be continuous.  
Full time student (12 units or more)
- 2 points Currently employed and has had continuous full-time employment for the past 6 months to 1 year.
- 1 point Currently employed full-time for less than 6 months, works temporary or part-time employment or is supported by an outside source (family, welfare, social security, workman's compensation, unemployment insurance).
- 0 points No visible means of support, or odd jobs.



**Prior Conviction – Score only for felony arrests**

- 1 point        3 or more misdemeanor convictions
- 2 points       2 or more felony convictions
- 3 points       Currently on O.R. or Bail for pending felony arrest

**Discretionary Points – Must be approved by a supervisor**

- 1 point        A person would only be assessed an additional point under extremely unusual circumstances, e.g., severe medical condition that requires immediate attention or a person is currently under treatment for.

### Information to be assessed for ACS Risk Assessment

Felony No Bail Hold- Includes Formal Probation, Parole, INS, CDC Detainer

Failures to appear and failure to comply with conditions of release in past 3 years. Gathered from DOJ/FBI Rap Sheet and the Local Record History. This data serves as a predicative indicator for potential likelihood of nonappearance.

Severity of Current Charges: Nature and Circumstances of current charges as related to the likelihood of nonappearance. Use the ACS Severity Offense Scale and rate the most serious charge.

Highest	9

Serious Offense History: Established by use of rap sheet and utilized to rate the most serious prior conviction. The use of criminal history is to be used as a predicative indicator for likelihood of recidivism.



- 1) All misdemeanors not listed above.
- 2) Municipal and County code violations.
- 3) Other criminal infractions with failure to pay, failure to appear, or failure to comply violations attached.
- 4) Misdemeanor violation of probation.

### Monitoring and Documentation

The following supervision scale and documentation procedure will be followed for those individuals placed on electronic monitoring by the Plumas County Sheriff's Office:

### High Supervision

#### Inmate Movement / Restriction

- The inmates' movement will be restricted to the following:
  - Their residence,
  - The Plumas County Jails
  - Prior approved court appearances and medical appointments.
    - If a *medical emergency* arises the inmate will be allowed to resolve the situation and immediately contact the Plumas County Jail of the circumstances and produce any and all paperwork to the Plumas County Jail *immediately, or the next day.*

#### Inmate Searches / Checks

- The inmates' residence will be searched a minimum of two (2) day(s) a week.
- The inmate will also be physically contacted an additional two (2) days a week by ACS Officers.
- Any contact will be logged in the LLC Track log by the contacting officer.
  - The officer will note the date, time, and type of inmate contact.
  - The officer will also note any issues or pending Disciplinary Action Reports.



## Medium Supervision

### Inmate Movement / Restriction

- The inmates' movement will be restricted to the following:
  - Their Residence
  - The Plumas County Jail
  - Job Site / Work Location / School
  - Prior approved court appearances and medical appointments.
    - If a *medical emergency* arises the inmate will be allowed to resolve the situation and immediately contact the Plumas County Jail of the circumstances and produce any and all paperwork to the Plumas County Jail *immediately, or the next day.*

### Inmate Searches / Checks

- The inmates' residence will be searched a minimum of one (1) day(s) a week.
- The inmate will also be physically contacted an additional two (2) days a week by ACS Officers.
- The inmate will be contacted via phone / office visit and additional one (1) days a week by ACS Officers.
- Any contact will be logged in the LLC Track log by the contacting officer.
  - The officer will note the date, time, and type of inmate contact.
  - The officer will also note any issues or pending Disciplinary Action Reports.



## Minimum Supervision

### Inmate Movement / Restriction

- The inmates' movement will be restricted to the following:
  - Their Residence
  - The Plumas County Jail
  - Job Site / Work Location / School
  
- Prior approved court appearances and medical appointments.
  - If a *medical emergency* arises the inmate will be allowed to resolve the situation and immediately contact the Plumas County Jail of the circumstances and produce any and all paperwork to the Plumas County Jail *immediately, or the next day.*

### Inmate Searches / Checks

- The inmates' residence will be searched a minimum of one (1) day(s) a week.
- The inmate will also be physically contacted an additional one (1) days a week by ACS Officers.
- The inmate will be contacted via phone / office visit and additional two (1) day(s) a week by ACS Officers.
- Any contact will be logged in the LLC Track log by the contacting officer.
  - The officer will note the date, time, and type of inmate contact.
  - The officer will also note any issues or pending Disciplinary Action Reports.





## Plumas County Sheriff's Office Alternative Custody Supervision DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

Inmates placed on the ACS that violate the rules of the program, or the facility, are subject to disciplinary action. The procedure is as follows:

1. The reporting officer shall note in the inmates' LLC track log, the time, date and nature of alert or action requiring disciplinary action.
2. The reporting officer shall generate an Incident Report citing the inmates' name, date, time, violation type, witnesses, and a synopsis of the incident/violation.
3. The officer will forward a copy of the report to the ACS Sergeant, Jail Commander and the Offender track log system.
4. The ACS Sergeant will conduct a Disciplinary Action Report hearing with the inmate named in the report.
  - a. The ACS Sergeant will find the inmate "responsible" or "not responsible" for the listed violation(s)
  - b. The ACS Sergeant will forward the DAR to the Jail Commander for disciplinary finding.
  - c. The ACS Sergeant will notify the inmate of the disciplinary finding
    - i. The inmate will be allowed to appeal the disciplinary finding if applicable per the *Jail Inmate Handbook*.

### Shock Incarceration

Inmates found responsible for multiple prior minor violations or a Serious / Major violation may be returned to the Main Jail for a Shock Incarceration period.

The ACS Sergeant / Jail Commander will determine if the offense(s) meets the criteria for Shock Incarceration which is as follows:

1. 3 or more Minor violations within a 30 day period
2. 2 or more Serious violations within a 30 day period
3. Any Major violation



## **Program Removal**

Inmates may only be removed from the ACS Program at the discretion of the ACS Sergeant or Jail Commander unless one of the following incidents has occurred:

- **Violation(s) of law** – where fresh charges are being filed on the ACS inmate
- **Possession of Firearms and or weapons defined in section 12020 of the Penal Code.**





## Plumas County Sheriff's Office Alternative Custody Supervision DISCIPLINARY CATEGORIES

The following rules as well as all the rules in the *Jail Inmate Handbook* are in effect to maintain the safety and security of the inmates, the staff and apply to all inmates while in the custody of the Plumas County Sheriff, whether housed in our facilities, assigned to one of the alternative to incarceration programs, or during transport to or from the facility. The Rules of Conduct are a form of administrative law and will be enforced under those guidelines. Violations of some rules are also violations of criminal law, and a criminal complaint may be filed against you with the District Attorney. Some violation may appear in more than one of the Major, Serious, or Minor sections. This enables the jail staff to make allowances for varying degrees of severity. It is your responsibility to read and understand these rules. *Ignorance is not an excuse!*

### **Minor Violations (Category One)**

Violation of a Category One rule(s) may result in one or more of the following:

- Verbal counseling, warning, or reprimand
- Disciplinary action which may result in:
  - Loss of one or more privileges for up to 7 days.

#### **Equipment and monitoring:**

1. Failure to report equipment problems
2. Early leave from residence / work / school without notification / justification
3. Late return from residence / work / school without notification / justification
4. Use of unauthorized transportation

#### **General Behavior:**

1. Failure to report law enforcement contact
2. Failure to report schedule changes
3. Possession of contraband

*Three Minor Violation offenses within a thirty-day period is a **Serious Violation** and will be addressed accordingly.*



## **Serious Violations (Category 2)**

Violation of a Category 2 rule(s) or a repeat violation of a Category 1 rule will result in one or more of the following:

- Disciplinary action which may include:
  - Loss of one or more privileges for up to 15 days
  - Loss of accrued good/work time.
  - Shock incarceration period

### **Equipment and monitoring:**

1. Equipment damage
  - a. HMU – damage
  - b. Ankle monitor / strap – damage
2. Unauthorized leave from residence
3. Failure to return directly home from approved work / school / meeting / program / appointment
4. Locked doors or outbuildings
5. Failure to confine pets (hostile animals)
6. Failure to provide proof of schedule
7. Failure to notify of phone / contact number change

### **General Behavior:**

1. Failure to follow verbal / written instructions
2. Disruptive conduct; inmate or other resident
3. Unauthorized visitors at residence

### **Drugs / Alcohol / Contraband:**

*A repeat violation of Serious rule is considered a **Major Violation** and will be addressed accordingly.*



### **Major Violation (Category 3)**

## Plumas County Sheriff's Office Alternative Custody Supervision (ACS)

Plumas County Sheriff's Department provides programs which are alternatives to standard jail incarceration. Alternative Custody Supervision is one of these Programs.

ACS is an **alternative to serving time in jail** – also referred to as “**house arrest**”. This is an alternative program which maintains accountability and monitors community re-entry. Eligibility is based on court orders, types of charges, number of days to serve, other cases pending, previous custody/programs history and a complete review of your file. **You must have a permanent residence in Plumas County and a landline telephone.** While on ACS, you may be allowed to go to school, work, medical appointments, probation, and court ordered programs. (If you work, it **must** be in **Plumas County**). There are administrative and participation fees that apply to this program. An application must be submitted for “**review and approval**” to the ACS Officer. (There are “Rules and Requirements” that must be kept.)

If you are accepted into the program you may be required to pay a fee. **Fees are assessed on a case by case basis.**

**We do not put individuals on this program for less than 10 days.**

When the ACS Officer receives an request for the program, the ACS Officer will gather all pertinent information regarding the applicant and if there is no blatant reason for not giving them an application (i.e. out of county warrants/holds, inmate has not been fully sentenced yet, etc.) they will give an application to the individual to fill out. When it is turned back into the ACS Officer, it will be reviewed (along with all pertinent information and papers) by the ACS staff. Items of importance are court/protective orders, severity of charges, length of current sentence, recent disciplinary action reports, etc.

The ACS staff will then determine if the applicant meets all eligibility requirements and is acceptable into the program, or not...

The Plumas County Sheriff's Alternative Custody has Rules & Regulations that must be observed. If an inmate is put on this program and **fails** – they can be immediately picked up and returned into custody. (Failure can be from a dirty drug test; possession of firearms, alcohol, illegal drugs or drug paraphernalia; phone disconnected; found somewhere that they were not suppose to be; etc.) If the inmate has failed and needs to be picked up and returned to jail, the ACS staff will do this!!!

A portion or all of the above mentioned Fee Schedule may be waived at the discretion of the ACS Staff. If an inmate feels the totality of their financial situation has not been fairly taken into consideration, the inmate may use the Appeals Process put forth in the Plumas County Sheriff's Office Alternative Custody Supervision General Order.

All monies collected through the ACS will be deposited in the AB 109 budget. The AB 109 budget is controlled by the CCP with Plumas County Board of Supervisors approval.



## LEASE AGREEMENT

This Lease Agreement is made on this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2012 by and between **SATELLITE TRACKING OF PEOPLE LLC** ("Lessor") and **COUNTY OF PLUMAS, a political subdivision of the State of California, by and through its Sheriff's Office** ("Lessee").

In consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and the receipt of other good and valuable considerations, the parties agree as follows:

### Scope of Work:

- Lessee desires to have the ability to utilize electronic monitoring services on certain individuals.
- Lessor desires to lease to Lessee certain equipment and services as set forth in Exhibit A.
- Title to all leased equipment shall remain with Lessor. Lessee is not purchasing any of the equipment set forth in Exhibit A. Instead, such equipment is being leased by Lessee solely for its use in the United States to assist in tracking the location of designated individuals (referred to herein as "Individuals").
- Lessee will promptly return all leased equipment to Lessor upon expiration of the lease term in its original condition, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

**Agreement Term and Renewal:** This Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date defined above and shall continue for the period of one (1) years, during which time Lessor provides the services set forth in Exhibit A, unless terminated or renewed as provided herein ("Initial Term"). Following the Initial Term, this Agreement, its terms and conditions and authorized amendments may be renewed for succeeding periods of one (1) year each on the anniversary of the Effective Date upon written amendment executed by the parties.

**Payment:** Lessor will provide Lessee with monthly invoices in accordance with Exhibit A. Lessor invoices are due and payable in full when presented. Lessee shall pay such invoices within thirty (30) days of Lessee's receipt of the invoices. Lessee is responsible for sales or use tax, if any, or any other similar state taxes or fees on the transactions hereunder.

**Shipping:** Unless otherwise agree to by Lessor, shipping of equipment will be done in accordance with Lessor's standard shipping terms of 2<sup>nd</sup> day delivery processed the day following receipt of the order. Lessor will pay shipping costs for faulty equipment returned for repair and/or replacement.

**Lessee's Obligations:** In addition to any obligations and responsibilities otherwise noted herein, Lessee understands and acknowledges that during the term of this Agreement and any renewals thereof, it (a) is has complete authority and responsibility for the selection, management and administration of Individuals, including but not limited to monitoring, (b) designating the monitoring level for all Individuals monitored with the leased equipment, (c) identifying and making available Lessee staff during the term of this Agreement, (d) establish alert notification protocols and parameters,

**Proprietary Property:** Title to any Intellectual Property, leased equipment, including its replacements, and all components of such equipment and replacements, including any software, shall not pass to Lessee as a result of this Agreement. Leased equipment may only be serviced and/or repaired by Lessor. As an attribute of the equipment lease and for only so long as such lease is not terminated or expired, Lessor grants to Lessee a personal, non-exclusive, and non-transferable license under certain U.S. Patents and other intellectual property rights, hereinafter "INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY," that Lessor has the right to license, such INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY pertaining to the leased equipment, including any software, and the intended use of such leased equipment. This license shall only extend to Lessee's use of the leased equipment as specified herein and for no other purpose. This license shall also extend only to that equipment whose lease from Lessor has not terminated or expired. Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, this license shall not be assignable or transferable by Lessee. In consideration of this license and as a requirement of the lease, Lessee agrees that it will not decompile, disassemble or otherwise reverse engineer the leased equipment, including any software, or cause or allow others to do so. Lessee will not modify, or cause or allow others, to modify the leased equipment and software, without the prior written consent of Lessor. Lessor or a professional audit firm selected by Lessor shall have the right, at Lessor's expense, to enter Lessee's premises during times and dates reasonably agreed upon by Lessee and Lessor, and make a reasonable examination of Lessee's records, the leased equipment and other things as may be necessary to verify that Lessee is s abiding by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

**Non-Infringement of Intellectual Property:** Lessor warrants that neither the products, processes, computer software, software modules, media, documentation and other materials provided to Lessee under this Agreement will infringe or constitute an infringement of any U.S. copyright, U.S. patent, U.S. trademark or other proprietary right of a third party. Should any such items become the subject of an infringement claim or suit, Lessor may obtain for Lessee the right to continue using such items or may replace or modify them to make them non-infringing. If Lessor, in its sole discretion, does not believe that either of these alternatives is reasonable, Lessor may require Lessee to stop using such items and Lessee agrees to immediately cease all infringing use. Lessee shall receive a pro-rated refund for any equipment or services for which Lessee has paid in advance if Lessor requires Lessee to cease using such equipment or services pursuant to this paragraph.

**Nondisclosure:** The parties hereto agree to protect all confidential proprietary information provided by one party to the other, and not to publish or disclose the other party's information to any third party without the other's written permission except as may be required by applicable law. The term proprietary information means confidential materials, documents, data and other information which Lessor or Lessee has designated or marked as proprietary and confidential. Neither Lessor nor Lessee will be required to



protect proprietary information, which is or becomes publicly available, (other than as a result of a breach of this Agreement) is independently developed by such party outside the scope of this Agreement, or is rightfully obtained from third parties.

**Warranties, Disclaimers and Indemnification:** Lessee is entitled to any warranties on leased equipment provided by the manufacturer of such equipment and which can be assigned to Lessee. **Lessor makes no other warranties regarding the products or services provided hereunder, express or implied, and Lessor specifically excludes any warranty of merchantability and fitness of its products and services for a particular purpose. Lessor expressly disclaims any warranty that its monitoring service or its system is impervious to tampering.** Lessee acknowledges that neither the equipment nor services provided herein shall prevent, and that neither is it intended to prevent, any individual from committing any harmful, tortuous, or illegal acts. Lessee further acknowledges that it may be possible for an individual to remove the equipment by unauthorized means, and that Lessor expressly disclaims any liability for any harmful, tortuous, or illegal acts committed by the individual. In no event does Lessor assume or bear any responsibility or liability for acts that may be committed by third Parties or persons subject to or using products or services. The parties hereto shall not be liable for any failure or delay in performance hereunder which is due to Force Majeure. For purposes of this Section, Force Majeure shall mean any event beyond the reasonable control of the parties, including, without limitation, failures of computers, computer-related equipment, hardware or software, network service coverage, fire, flood, riots, strikes, epidemics, war (declared or undeclared and including the continuance, expansion or new outbreak of any war or conflict now in existence), embargoes and governmental actions or decrees.

**Miscellaneous Provisions: Continued Performance:** When this Agreement terminates, both Parties will continue to comply with all of the terms of this Agreement which call for performance prior or subsequent to the termination date, including their respective obligations to protect confidential proprietary information. **Breach and Non-payment Termination:** In the event a breach of this Agreement occurs by Lessee by any reason, including non-payment, then Lessor shall notify Lessee who shall then have fifteen (15) calendar days to cure said breach. In the event of a failure to cure, Lessor, in addition to exercising any other rights or remedies that may be available, may terminate this Agreement upon twenty-four (24) hours notice. The occurrence of any of the following events shall constitute an Event of Default or Breach under this Agreement: (i) Either Party fails to comply with any other term, condition or covenant contained in this Agreement and does not cure that failure as specified herein; (ii) A petition in bankruptcy is filed by or against either Party or a receiver or trustee of any property of either Party is appointed, (iii) Either Party is dissolved, liquidated or terminated, or either Party ceases its ongoing business operations, sales activity of Support Services, without prior written consent of the other Party, (iv) Any act or omission of either Party, which adversely effects the reputation of the other; (v) The passage of any legislation which would impair or jeopardize the ability of Lessor to maintain Lessor's proprietary rights in the Intellectual Property for the products and services covered by this Agreement. **Statute of Limitations:** the parties hereby agree that the statute of limitations for any action for fault hereunder by either Party, including for breach of warranty or indemnity, shall be one (1) year after a cause of action accrues. **Venue:** This Agreement shall be governed, interpreted and construed under the laws of the State of California. **No Third Party Beneficiaries:** This Agreement is intended for the exclusive benefit of Lessor, Lessee and their permitted affiliates and assigns and is not intended and shall not be construed as conferring any benefit on any third party or the general public. **Successors:** this Agreement shall be binding upon the respective successors, affiliates and assigns of the parties. **Modifications and Waivers:** if either party waives or modifies any term or condition of this Agreement, this will not void, waive or change any other term or condition. If either party waives a default by the other, this will not waive future or other defaults. If any part of this Agreement, for any reason is declared to be invalid, it shall be deemed modified as necessary to be valid. The remainder of this Agreement shall continue in effect as if the Agreement has been entered without the invalid portion. **Entire Agreement:** This Agreement sets forth the full understanding between the parties and may only be changed in writing, dully executed by both Parties. **Acknowledgement:** The parties acknowledge that they have had an opportunity to fully examine this Agreement and completely understand its terms, and that they approve the same including all of the terms and conditions.







- Transmits monitoring data to VeriTracks using one of two types of telephone service: analog/landline and most digital (non-VoIP).



# BLUHOME

{home-based monitoring unit}


When enrollees live in geographic areas with insufficient cell phone coverage, BluHome provides the ideal solution by transmitting monitoring data through analog/landline or most digital (non-VoIP) telephone service in the enrollee's home. BluHome receives RF signals from BluTag and BluBand, which confirms the enrollee's presence. When paired with BluBand, this unit has the capability to transmit data, such as enters and leaves, using nationwide cell phone networks.

## EASY INSTALLATION

BluHome is easy to set up and install. When one of the pre-set RF signal ranges (small = 100 feet, medium = 200 feet and large = 300 feet) is appropriate, enrollees can install the unit in their residence. If a customized range is required, supervising agents can do so in increments of 1 foot.

Unlike a traditional GPS charging or docking station, BluHome does not charge or hold any piece of monitoring equipment. It is a simple, freestanding unit that plugs into a standard 110-volt electrical outlet and RJ-11 telephone jack.

Maintaining BluHome's operations does not require any interaction from the enrollee.



## BLUHOME HIGHLIGHTS

- > Receives RF signals from BluTag and BluBand, confirming the presence of an enrollee in a designated location.
- > Constantly searches the RF band for clear channels, which helps ensure an enrollee's positive enters and leaves.
- > Transmits monitoring data using analog/landline or most digital (non-VoIP) telephone service in the enrollee's home or AT&T or T-Mobile cell phone networks.
- > No additional charge to include BluHome in an agency's suite of monitoring tools when using the analog/landline or digital (non-VoIP) phone service in the enrollee's home.

# BLUBOX


{optional GPS monitoring accessory}

When an enrollee lives in a geographic area where it is difficult for BluTag to receive GPS signals, BluBox offers an ideal solution. This optional auxiliary unit confirms the presence of an enrollee when at home through an encrypted RF signal. BluTag continues transmitting monitoring data to VeriTracks using nationwide cell phone networks while in the presence of BluBox. If the enrollee leaves the RF signal range of BluBox, BluTag immediately resumes its standard GPS operations and transmits the event to VeriTracks using AT&T or T-Mobile cell phone networks.

## EASY INSTALLATION

BluBox is easy to set up and install using one of its pre-set RF signal ranges (small = 100 feet, medium

= 200 feet and large = 300 feet). Installation is so easy, even enrollees can install the unit in their residence. Simply place BluBox in a central location in the house that is close to a standard 110-volt electrical outlet. If electrical service is interrupted, a back-up battery powers BluBox for approximately 24 hours.



## BLUBOX HIGHLIGHTS

- > Confirms the presence of an enrollee at home when the residence is located in a geographic area where it is difficult for BluTag to receive GPS signals and location points.
- > The enrollee and BluTag are automatically connected to BluBox through BluTag's encrypted RF signal.

- > Receives RF signals from BluTag, which transmits monitoring data to VeriTracks using AT&T or T-Mobile cell phone networks.

# STALKER ALERT


{victim notification device}

Timely receipt of information about the location of a perpetrator is critical to helping victims of domestic violence stay safe. Developed by STOP, Stalker Alert warns victims on the proximity of the perpetrator by using GPS technology, mobile zones and nationwide cell phone service.

## HOW IT WORKS

The victim is given a Stalker Alert device and instructed to carry it around at all times in a briefcase or handbag or attach it to the victim's belt or waistband. The perpetrator's supervising agent creates a circular mobile exclusion zone around the victim, which moves with the victim. The size of the zone is based on the order of protection. Because this is an exclusion zone, the perpetrator cannot enter it without immediately setting off a violation notification.

If the perpetrator enters the mobile exclusion zone, Stalker Alert immediately recognizes the violation. Using AT&T or T-Mobile cell phone networks, Stalker Alert transmits the information to VeriTracks, so the perpetrator's supervising agent and other designated individuals receive the information in near real time and can take appropriate action. At the same time, Stalker Alert performs two actions to alert the victim to the perpetrator's proximity: begins emitting an audible tone and sends a text message to the victim's cell phone.



## STALKER ALERT HIGHLIGHTS

- > Small, lightweight device uses GPS technology, mobile exclusion zones and nationwide cell phone networks to communicate with the victim, supervising agent and law enforcement officials.
- > Operates for at least 48 hours on a single charge and the battery recharges in one hour every 24 hours.
- > Even while charging the battery, the device continuously monitors the proximity of the perpetrator.
- > Weighs less than seven ounces and its dimensions are 4.7" x 3" x 1.1".
- > Works with BluTag and VeriTracks.



# BLUSCAN

{mobile monitoring unit}



As a mobile monitoring unit, BluScan allows supervising officers in the field to confirm the presence of up to 16 enrollees simultaneously without making visual contact. It receives RF signals from BluTag and BluBand, as well as information concerning the battery and tamper status of both devices. BluScan also receives information regarding BluTag's receipt of GPS signals.

The hand-held device is powered through a built-in battery or plugging the device into a standard 110-volt electrical outlet or a vehicle's electrical outlet. The battery powers the unit for at least three days. Supervising officers can also place the unit on a flat surface for hands-free viewing using the built-in stand on the backside of the case.

## BLUSCAN HIGHLIGHTS

- > Confirms the presence of up to 16 enrollees simultaneously without making visual contact with the enrollee.
- > Scanning range extends to 300 feet and built-in memory stores 5,000 events on a continuous recording or as-needed basis.
- > Recorded data downloads onto a computer for reporting purposes.
- > Configures the RF signal range of BluBox.
- > Weighs approximately seven ounces and its dimensions are 7" x 4.25" x 1.25".
- > Works with BluTag, BluBand and BluBox.
