Covid-19 Update. July 13, 2021

Cases. Plumas County's Covid-19 case rate was 3.76 per 100,000 for the 7-day period ending July 12. This is similar to the level seen around this date in 2020, as shown in the epidemic curve. There have been no new Covid cases since July 8th and no evidence of outbreaks related to re-opening in June. Small case clusters that occurred in the east and west regions of the county in previous weeks have been contained with no new cases. There have been no new hospitalizations or deaths.

Vaccination. Vaccination efforts are continuing with help from the hospitals and pharmacies: 46% of county residents are fully vaccinated and 51% have had at least one dose (these figures now include 12-17 year-olds). We believe vaccination is the main reason we have been able to reopen without increased case numbers. We are engaging with the Forest Service to vaccinate firefighters working the Beckwourth Complex fire.
