For the Board of Supervisors:

The Sierra Institute for Community and Environment is requesting the use of either the Recreation Center or the Memorial Hall at no cost for the P-CREW youth conservation program 2021 annual reunion. The reunion will be held from December 28, 2021 until December 31, 2021. Participants will include 14 high school students and two P-CREW staff supervisors. For the 2021 P-CREW reunion, we are hoping to host the event in Chester to facilitate a safe and healthy process of reflection on the impacts of the Dixie Fire to forest health, community resilience, and individual local youth whose families were personally affected. We are planning various activities to promote social and emotional learning, environmental education, and participation in community service projects. The Lassen National Forest will be contributing snowshoes to our group to support a snow recreation day to teach youth how to navigate and play in the snow safely. The second day will be structured around a community service project, and we welcome you to identify any opportunities that best serve the Chester community!

We strive to provide this experience to youth at minimal to no cost to limit the financial burden on participants and ensure equal access. This past summer we were not able to run half of our summer program due to the Dixie Fire and lost significant funding as a result. Additionally, grants that have historically offered compensation for the expenses of the reunion have been suspended until further notice as a result of the global COVID-19 pandemic. Access to an affordable local facility will ensure that we are able to offer this unique, impactful experience to youth. Any assistance you may be able to contribute in ensuring we may provide this opportunity would be greatly appreciated and we are enthusiastic to engage P-CREW alumni in a meaningful service project that will support our communities and landscapes which have been so deeply impacted by the Dixie Fire.

District 1







District 1











District 1








