V. INTRODUCTIONS

Matthew Freidman, Office Chief, Office of Aviation Planning, Caltrans Division of Aeronautics, introduced himself and stated he would be assisting Gabbie Sefranek, Associate Transportation Planner, Office of Aviation Planning, Caltrans Division of Aeronautics, with the presentation to the Airport Land Use Commission concerning Airport Land Use Compatibility Plans.

Gabbie Sefranek, Associate Transportation Planner, Office of Aviation Planning, Caltrans Division of Aeronautics, introduced herself and stated she would be giving the presentation to the Airport Land Use Commission concerning Airport Land Use Compatibility Plans.

VII. COMMISSION MEMBER COMMENT PERIOD

A. Chair's Report

Commissioner Ron Matlock commented on the state of the pilot's lounge (lounge) at Nervino Airport stating Plumas County Facility Services made improvements to the lounge, the lounge looks great, and Mr. Nervino was impressed with the lounge.

B. Commissioners' Comments

Commissioner Gordon Bennie stated it is important to obtain a quorum to do the site visit to Roger Field.

VIII. BOARD OF SUPERVISOR'S CORNER

Opportunity for County Supervisors to address issues related to ALUC.

No County Supervisors present, and no issues presented related to the ALUC.

IX. COUNTY STAFF CORNER

A. Airport Managers' Appointee Commissioner Vacancy Application

Tracey Ferguson, Planning Director, stated that an application has been received from Brendan Herbert to be Airport Manager of Nervino Airport and he also applied for the

ALUC vacancy. Ferguson went on further to state the appointment of Brendan Herbert would go before the Board of Supervisors to confirm the appointment of Brendan Herbert by JD Moore, Facility Services Director/Airports Manager, to the ALUC.

Commissioner Gordon Bennie questioned if Brendan Herbert being on the ALUC and being the Airport Manager at Nervino is a conflict of interest. Commissioner Jon Kennedy stated there would not be a conflict of interest as Brendan Herbert's duties as an Airport Manager and a Commissioner on the ALUC are separate.

- B. Nervino Airport Manager appointment (0.625 FTE) of Brendan Herbert and authorization of employment agreement by Board of Supervisors (September 13, 2022) – Exhibit A (Scope of Work)*

Ferguson noted that Planning staff provided Exhibit A (Scope of Work) for awareness to the ALUC.

- C. County of Plumas Airport Land Lease Agreement – September 6, 2022 Board of Supervisors Meeting Public Comment*

Ferguson stated the airport land lease agreement (agreement) went before the Board of Supervisors (Board) on September 6, 2022, in which the Board received feedback from the public on the agreement and further negotiations with County Counsel were requested by the public.

Commissioner Ron Matlock informed the ALUC and Planning staff that further negotiations occurred with County Counsel and changes to the agreement are ongoing.

Ferguson noted that Planning staff would follow up with County Counsel on the additional negotiations.

Commissioner Gordon Bennie inquired with Sefranek and Friedman about how to decide whether a conventional runway is not required (e.g., Stol aircraft) and the number of years

into the future the ALUCP should take into account (e.g., 25 years).

Commissioner Shawn McKenzie commented that the ALUC has a lot to consider in relation to the types of aircraft that can utilize the airports.

Friedman explained a situation in San Jose where Geographic Information System (GIS) tools and existing data sets were used to do constraint mapping and account for new technology.

Ferguson bridged the conversation by mentioning the expansion of the airport runways would allow for larger aircraft to bring more cargo, etc., and asking if Division staff knows of ALUCPs that account for the future. Sefranek responded that she has seen ALUCPs that account for the future and have future noise contours.

XI. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: PURSUANT TO ALUC POLICIES, RULES, AND REGULATIONS

A. Confirm Commissioner Proxy Appointments

Upon receipt of the proxy forms from Commissioner Gordon Bennie and Commissioner Shawn McKenzie appointing other commissioners as their proxies, Ferguson stated Planning staff would discuss such appointments with County Counsel to ensure there would be no issues such as a 'daisy chain' and would be discussed further at the next regularly scheduled ALUC meeting.

XII. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: Review and Update Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan – Rogers Field

Ferguson read aloud from Section G of the Rogers Field ALUCP that one runway is oriented at "16/34" and is 5,000 feet long, with an abandoned runway at oriented at "05/23."

Commissioner Shawn McKenzie explained that the abandoned runway is denoted on the pavement by an "X." Commissioner Gordon Bennie added that the "X" means the runway shall not be used.

Ferguson noted the runway elevations being 4,529 feet above means sea level (msl) for the airport reference point, 4,531 feet at the northerly end of the runway, and 4,510 feet msl at the southerly end of the runway.

Ferguson noted Section G(5) mentioned a "non-precision instrument approach." Commissioner Shawn McKenzie stated Rogers Field has an instrument approach, but it's private. He went on further to explain that the owner of the instrument approach must give permission to use the instrument approach and the owner is liable for those who use the instrument approach.

XIII. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: Set date for Commissioners' site visit to Rogers Field

Commissioner Shawn McKenzie suggested having the next regularly scheduled ALUC meeting (November 16, 2022) and the site visit to Rogers Field. The decision was made by the Commissioners and Planning staff to have the site visit to Rogers Field after the regularly scheduled ALUC meeting on November 16, 2022.
