I am pleased to submit, in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code, Sierra County Annual Crop Report for 2021. This report summarizes the acreage, production, and gross values of agricultural commodities produced in Sierra County. It does not attempt to show county inventory, cost of production, or net income of agricultural producers.

Sierra County's 2021 estimated commodity production value is \$11,426,802 plus an additional \$299,263 for timber production. Livestock continues to be the primary commodity produced in Sierra County followed by Field Crops. Our niche markets are surging in Sierra County with healthy gains in the Organic and specialty livestock sectors. This report includes a summary of sustainable agriculture activities, which have been completed by the department in 2021. The purpose of these activities is to prevent and control the spread of exotic and/or invasive plant and insect pests throughout Sierra County using integrated pest management techniques.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the many producers, agricultural business representatives, and public agencies that have cooperated in supplying data and especially to Dax Albrecht, who helped compile this report.

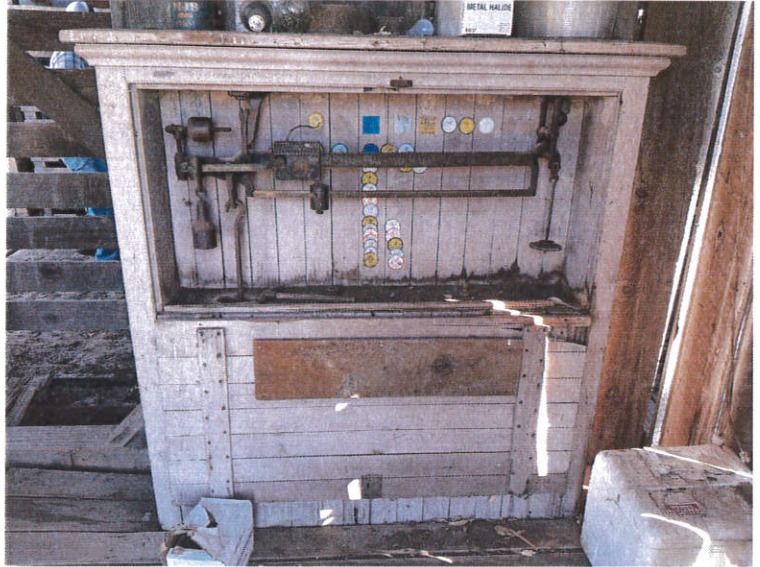
