



June 14th:

Attention State Route 70 Travelers: With SR 70 now reopen following multiple full closures from slide activity earlier this year, motorists should note the current construction and delays occurring on the route.

Please note this information is current as of mid-June:

- Deadwood Road/Jarbo Gap area (Butte County): 24/7 one-way traffic control with 5-minute delays (via traffic signal) for continued slip-out emergency work.
- Cresta area (Butte County): 24/7 one-way traffic control with up to 15-minute delays (via traffic signal) for road-raising project.
- Just east of the Greenville Wye (Plumas County): 24/7 one-way traffic control with 5 – 15 minute delays for continued slide repairs.
- Bridge maintenance project (Plumas County): Work currently at North Fork Feather River Bridge (east of Belden) – minimal delays (5-minutes), Monday – Friday during daytime hours. Planned to start in early July – work at Indian Creek Bridge (east of the Greenville Wye) – minimal delays (5-minutes), Monday – Friday during daytime hours.
- PG&E Undergrounding Projects (from near Butte/Plumas County line to east of Belden, near Twain, and upcoming east of the Greenville Wye) – 24-hour traffic control with up to 30-minute delays during daytime hours (all projects combined), with up to 45-minute delays overnights.
- Cromberg Rehab Project (Plumas County – from west of Cromberg to east of Portola): One-way traffic control with up to 30-minute delays, Monday – Friday during daytime hours.

Please plan ahead, allot extra time for delays, and drive slowly and carefully in and around work zones. 24/7 updated highway conditions can always be found on QuickMap:
