**II. HEARING – SPECIAL USE PERMIT: SCHRAMMEL, DAVID & MERRI; APNs 120-062-002 & 120-062-007 (Taylorsville); T.26N/R.10E/S.34 MBM; Planner: Rebecca Herrin.**

Request to establish a charter school for grades 9 through 12. The proposal is to use the existing building on APN 120-062-007 and the adjacent two lots for the school site. The school will serve around 50 students and teachers with 4 to 5 regular staff members. The project is exempt from CEQA (Section 15061(b)(3)). This project is located at 4338 and 4352 Main Street, Taylorsville.

**III. HEARING – VARIANCE: HUGO, DENNIS & TRACEY; APN 100-141-004 (Chester); T.28N/R.7E/S.8 MDM Planner: Rebecca Herrin**

Request for a variance of the south side yard setback from 10 feet to 5.5 feet for construction of a new roofline to make the second floor area usable, accessible space, and to correct drainage problems. The project is exempt from CEQA (Section 15305). This property is located at 412 Second Avenue, Chester.
