Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

The 2,534 acre project area exhibits excessive stand density and associated elevated levels of conifer mortality in response to the combined factors of stand density and extended drought. The Franks Valley Forest Health Project has been designed to 1) Improve landscape-level forest health treatments through mechanical thinning, 2) Reduce forest fuels through hand thinning and prescribed fire, 3) Improve wildlife habitat by enhancing aspen habitat through the reduction of conifer competition and encroachment, and 4) Improve watershed conditions through the obliteration of non-system roads. The project area is within both the planning areas of the Moonlight Restoration EA and the Plumas Audubon Genesee Wildfire Restoration Plan. These combined projects will restore forested stands on the landscape level.

Reasons why project is exempt:

CEQA does not apply to prescribed fire, thinning, or fuel reduction projects undertaken on federal lands to reduce the risk of high-severity wildfire that have been reviewed under the NEPA if the primary role of a state or local agency is providing funding or staffing for those projects. Cal Fire has provided funding through the Forest Health Grants Program for fuel reduction on 2,354 acres of federal land within the Plumas National Forest. The proposed project was reviewed in its entirety under NEPA through review of the project Decision Memo and supporting specialist reports. The Decision Memo was signed May 9, 2019.
