- Website updated
- Continuing education available via website
- Still monitoring air ambulance and things are going well

#### COVID-19

- Vaccination with almost 50% having at least received first dose
- Thank you to local healthcare facilities and EMS for assisting PH with vaccination efforts
- Currently in Orange Tier
- PH working with schools to vaccinate 16 & 17 year old with Pfizer
- Johnson and Johnson currently on hold
- MYTurn system being utilized

## **HeartSafe Community**

- Update from Central Plumas
  - o CPR classes just starting up for public
  - o AED to be donated to HeartSafe in Indian Valley
- AED Registration- there is map through Pulse Point app and anyone can register AED in their community
  - o Pulse Point images are there for approval
- Letter of Intent received from EPHC Ambulance:
  - Still working on application process
  - o MOU with Eastern Plumas Fire District to teach CPR classes
  - o CPR classes conducted in schools
  - AED placed in Mohawk Resource center with Chief Ward will maintain and ensure training
  - o AED placed in Feather River RV Park
  - Would like to place AED at Chalet View Lodge

- o Replacing pads next week
- o Will register all newly placed AED in Pulse Point
- Lake Almanor Area
  - o AED placed in catholic church
  - CPR/AED classes

#### **Health Care Coalition (Tri-HCC):**

- The Tri-HCC next meeting is on May 5, 2021 at 10:00 am.
- On April 1, 2021, the rough draft of Infectious Disease Annex was uploaded into the CAT
- Plumas County received additional funding for local hospitals and EMS related to COVID-19 and was able to purchase equipment/supplies for those who requested.

#### **PCSO- Communication Update:**

- Mike Grant provides update:
  - o Beckwourth Peak had to be repaired
  - Huff med comm repeater may be having some issues, which has hopefully been resolved
- I Am Responding app: Connected into Dispatch console
  - I Am Responding's software will need to be re-written in order to meet Plumas County's need

### **Agency Reports:**

- PDH Ambulance (REMSA/Care flight): Looking to hire paramedics, EMT classes in Indian Valley, Type 1 ambulance to be picked up next week
- EPHC: stable, COVID unit demobilized still utilizing screener and opening up the lobby
- Fire Chief's Association: Meeting on the 17<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am at Graeagle Fire
- Peninsula Fire: Things are improving from COVID, difficulty finding fire/paramedics
- PDH Hospital: New ambulance, 5 Year anniversary with REMSA/Care Flight, COVID is no longer primary focus, new SNF to be opened within 3 years, Day care open for 0-5 year old and looking at easing access restrictions for clinics/hospital
- CHP: Thank you to Jerry and Mark from Nor-Cal, on-line continuing education going well, good communication when responding to traffic accidents
- SO Dispatch: Dispatch is quickly overwhelmed during a traffic accident due to
  coordination of resources, follow-up calls regarding resources, such as cancellation or
  ordering of resources need to occur on scene; scene assessment training would be
  beneficial as well as communication between CHP dispatch in Susanville and PCSO
  dispatch. There are some CHP radio issue sin Lassen/Plumas areas (Sgt Brothers will talk
  with Susanville Dispatch regarding providing information to PCSO dispatch) According to
  Mike Grant during one incident (traffic accident) USFS start ordering resources, because
  they were first on the scene, so there were three separate dispatch agencies involved in

- ordering of resources. There should be a dispatch protocol or procedures for a response involving multiple dispatch agencies in one geographical area.
- Nor Cal EMS: On line training on Nor Cal website and she would like to be included regarding any training or information on dispatch communications
- Seneca Hospital: Trying to figure out what daily business will be like after COVID
- REMSA/ CareFlight: 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary for REMSA, a big milestone
- Public Health: The State is utilizing ambulance strike teams for homebound vaccinations, just like what Plumas County has been doing since vaccinations occurred
