

Medical Facilities & Services Plan Requirements

Please be sure to address the following elements in your medical plan and also attach a completed ICS Form 206 Medical Plan (attached):

1. Designated First Aid Station.
2. Description of general medical and safety considerations for participant and non-participant (spectator, by-stander) safety
3. Description of communication plan between venue personnel/coordinators/and security personnel and medical personnel. Communication between licensed Paramedic (EMT-P) and 911 response dispatch and teams must be assured redundantly via radio, cellular, and/or land-line telecommunications.
4. On site availability of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and personnel certified in its use. Any gathering event with more 500 individuals in one location reasonably requires availability of an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) and personnel certified in its use. Availability of this device and an individual with appropriate certification is required 24/7.
5. On site availability of basic resuscitation equipment and medications in addition to other basic equipment and supplies including, but not limited to, blood pressure cuff, basic splinting and bandaging supplies, and immobilization devices.
6. A minimum of one California licensed Paramedic (EMT-P) for the duration of the event is required. This is due to the remoteness of this event from stationed EMS personnel and the co-existence of the High Sierra Music Festival in Quincy during this same time frame.
7. Completion of ICS Form 206, Medical Plan, and availability of this document to venue staff, event personnel and medical personnel; provide Plumas County Public Health Agency, ATTN: Rosie Olney, Management Analyst, rosieolney@countyofplumas.com, with a copy of completed ICS 206 at least two weeks prior to event.
