



If archaeological resources are found during building or grading, work shall cease until further archaeological study is conducted to determine the significance of the site and any needed mitigations and that the building or grading permit shall be conditioned to implement those mitigations in a manner which satisfies the Planning Director.

No building or grading permits shall be issued for work within areas with slopes more than 15% unless an erosion control plan is prepared, submitted to the County Engineer and approved, and that all work must comply with the erosion control plan.

Emergency water for fire protection shall be provided before final inspection for building construction as set forth in Article 10 of Chapter 4 of Title 9 of the Plumas County Code.

The road shown hereon is a private easement not subject to improvements or maintenance by Plumas County. Such easements will not become effective unless and until reservations and grants are included in the respective deeds.
