**DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:**

Found two stump holes in proximity of corner position, both badly decomposed and indeterminate in position. Found nearby dead and down remains of badly decayed tree with 1949 BT sign nearby.

A white fir, 8 ins. diam., alive and healthy, bears N. 32° W., 9.0 ft. dist., with healed blaze.  
A dead and standing white fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 68° W., 20.7 ft. dist., with scribe marks visible in partially healed blaze.


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**DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:**

Found a rock mound, 3 ft. diam., 6 ins. high, from which the original bearing trees  
A pine, 28 ins. diam., alive and healthy, bears S. 85½° E., 84 lks. dist., with scribe marks clearly visible on partially healed blaze.  
A pine, 29 ins. diam., alive and healthy, bears N. 81° W., 100 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

**DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:**

At the exact position of the stone mound, set a standard USDA Forest Service 3½ ins. diam. alum. cap on ¼ in. diam. by 30 ins. long alum. drive rod, buried 24 ins. in the gnd., with magnet in 9 ins. long break-away base, in rock collar, mkd. as shown




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**DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:**

Found an embedded mound of stone, 3 ft. diam. by 1 ft. high.  
From which the original bearing trees

The remains of a decaying pine stump, bears N. 56½° E., 244 lks. dist., with evidence of old blaze.  
A pine, 37 ins. diam., alive and healthy, bears S. 47½° E., 123 lks. dist., with scribe mks. visible in partially opened blaze.  
A dead and standing pine snag, 35 ins. diam., bears S. 59° W., 87 lks. dist., with healed blaze.  
A decomposing pine stump, 3½ ft. diam., with remains of tree lying nearby, bears N. 50½° W., 139.5 ft. dist.



Thorough search of area finds no evidence of original corner. Search area has been logged extensively. Corner is determined lost and reestablished by proportionate measurement.

**DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:**

Found remains of the original bearing trees: a high stumped ponderosa pine with partially overgrown rotted blaze face, and Forest Service location tag attached and mkd with initials RGO and dated 5/10/68 (Record = S. 76° E. 56 lks. dist.) Found a stump hole, indeterminate species, but a Douglas fir grows out of the remains, at record position (Record = N. 74° W. 23 lks. dist.). A Forest Service corner card form by R.G. Olding, dated 6/3/68 states

A 38° ponderosa pine high cut stump bears S. 76° E. 56 lks. P.P. BT was killed by bugs, I had fallers cut it off above scribbling which is grown over.


A 28° high rotted w.f. stump, broken off - scribed bears N. 74° W. 23 lks. Scribbling on one w.f. stump is still legible but stump is badly rotted away.

Both BTs in very poor condition.

I find the position of the corner from the recovered BT remains to be harmonious with nearby cadastral corners and accept the position as the best available evidence of the original corner position.

**DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:**

At the position determined by remains of original bearing trees, set a standard USDA Forest Service 3½ ins. diam. alum. cap on ¼ in. diam. by 30 ins. long alum. drive rod, buried 25 ins. in the gnd., with magnet in 9 ins. long break-away base, in rock collar, mkd. as shown

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

A pine, 29 ins. diam., alive and healthy, bears N. 81° W., 100 lks. dist., with healed blaze.


