## **HAZARDOUS AREA**

### **ENTER AT YOUR OWN RISK**

**FOR YOUR SAFETY, PLEASE WEAR APPROPRIATE  
PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)**

Plumas County has declared a health emergency due to the presence of hazardous materials and damaged infrastructure, and advises against entering this area.

In the burn area, you will encounter dangerous conditions and will be exposed to toxic and hazardous materials, and fall and entrapment hazards, including, but are not limited to:

- Hot materials, including: embers and ash
- Hazardous and toxic materials, including: ash, asbestos, toxic metals, oils, fire retardants, pesticides, solvents, and other hazardous materials
- Puncture hazards, including: broken pipes, exposed nails, broken glass, damaged structural elements
- Potential explosive hazards, including: propane tanks, ammunition, and solvents
- Toxic hazards, including: airborne particles and vapors
- Physical and Entrapment hazards, including: open or weakened septic tanks and tank lids, slippery and uneven surfaces, unstable structures, and hazardous trees

Fire damage may have created significant health and safety hazards on this property. It is recommended to not disturb structure ash due to potential exposure to toxic materials.

**Property owners should not commence cleanup of their destroyed structures until approved to do so by Plumas County. Beginning cleanup on your own may preclude you from future government assistance.**
