Plumas County schedules first workshop in redistricting process

Plumas County to work with experts, census data, and communities to define Supervisorial districts

Quincy, Calif. (September 9, 2021) – **Plumas County** has scheduled the first meeting in the 2021 redistricting process. Every ten years, local governments use new census data to redraw their district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. State law requires cities and counties to engage communities in the redistricting process by holding public hearings, workshops and conducting public outreach. Plumas County is working to engage residents in the process through community-based outreach and online at the County's website:
