Plumas Rural Services and Northern Valley Catholic Social Service provide support, advocacy, resources and referrals to survivors of the Dixie Fire, regardless of where they live now, through the Disaster Case Management Program (DCMP). The DCMP goal is to help you and your family return to a sanitary and secure home that feels safe.

Disaster Case Managers help survivors identify a range of unmet needs, develop a plan to meet those needs, and then provide assistance with local, state and federal aid programs. Survivors can get assistance whether their home is habitable or destroyed, whether they want to rebuild or not, and whether they remain in the county where they lived at the time of the fire or not.

DCMP staff are available to:

- answer your questions
- offer you support
- help you develop a recovery plan
- connect you with appropriate referrals/resources in your community
- work with you to see which financial assistance you may be eligible for
- advocate on your behalf with service and benefit providers
