



ECONOMIC Potential Projects



Indian Valley Disaster Resiliency Academy

Description: Provide training and hands-on experience to prepare for, avoid, and mitigate disaster impacts. Partners and experts in disaster prevention, recovery, and resiliency would develop the curriculum. On-site post-disaster housing examples could house trainees and would increase post-disaster temporary housing.



Chester Town Plaza

Description: Complete the Town Plaza building and outdoor spaces to provide a year-round activities center. With an outdoor market, this regional economic driver will bring residents and visitors to the Chester and Lake Almanor Basin to stimulate the local and countywide economy. It also supports resident health, education, culture, and recreation.



Connected Communities Project

Description: Stimulate the economy via +/- 600 miles of new trails which will recreationally connect 15 mountain towns and smaller populations across Plumas and 5 other counties. Phase 1 prepared a Master Plan. Phase 2 is Environmental Review. Phase 3 is Construction. Phase 4 is maintenance.



Complete & Retain “The Spot”

Description: Complete “The Spot” in Greenville with carports, signage, fencing, plants, lighting and entrance kiosk. With landowners, on-site businesses, and the County, explore feasibility of meeting conditions required to retain the business district long-term. All would need to be in agreement before it could be implemented.



Mountain Modular Home Plant

Description: A Utah-based modular home plant would be established in Plumas County. The plant would include housing for its workers. It would help meet the needs of disaster survivors, address a long-standing shortage of affordable housing, and could utilize local wood resources.

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Commercial Meat Processing Feasibility Study

Description: This project would collect data from local ranchers, identify USDA Meat Processing Certifications, explore funding sources to support startup of an efficient local Meat Processing System, and develop a concise feasibility study for implementation.



Plumas-Sierra-Lassen Chamber Coalition

Description: Hire an Executive Director to create and administer a Charitable Impact Fund. They would have three years become self-sustaining through grants, partners, and County support. The Coalition would also lead development and/or enhancement of Visitor Centers in all of the Chamber communities.



Maker Space & Sales Venue

Description: Develop a facility with specialized equipment such as wood and metal work, printing capabilities, painting, and digital resources. Users would submit a proposal, and reserve resources. Safety and other job and vocational training likely to occur, along with retail space for made products.



Community Kitchen & Food Processing

Description: A commercial kitchen where community members can safely produce food products for sale, with dry and cold storage and packaging and labeling equipment, as needed to support sales both locally and for export. It could serve as a training facility for food handling safety and community events.



Sacred Waters of Greenville

Thermal Wellness Center

Description: Identify a suitable location in Greenville to acquire and construct a thermal waters wellness center. It would have an educational focus to assist residents to create healthy and sustainable lifestyles. Build multi-family housing onsite/nearby for staff and visitors. Project to be developed in 3 phases.



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Discover the Lost Sierra Economic Development Initiative

Description: Create a website for tourists, locals, and new residents to learn what Plumas and Sierra Counties (Lost Sierra) have to offer as a destination to live, work and play. Will include event calendars, business promotion, and other features to target of 50,000 to 100,000 website visits within 18 months.



Building Rural Economies with Rural Communities Assistance Corporation

Description: Rural Communities Assistance Corporation (RCRC) (a non-profit) would: 1. Work with Chester & Quincy leaders/entrepreneurs excited to identify and take on economic opportunities. 2. Provide Training on Start, Grow & Revive Your Business. 3. Provide one-on-one consultation and help local businesses develop regional linkages.



General Business & Marketplace Cooperative

Description: Help local craft and businesses bring their products to market through a cooperative with shared digital presence and a private distribution business based in Plumas County. The primary goal is to brand and export "Plumas Made" products. Potentially create a retail space in Greenville.



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
