





Good morning. Last night, we had a small earthquake. Nothing like the 5.5 we had last spring, but measurable activity.



Dawson said the two recent earthquakes appeared to have come between the Almanor Fault Zone and one known as the Skunk Flat Fault. The latter is just south of the reservoir.



A map by the California Geological Survey shows movement near the Lake Almanor area in Placer County where a magnitude 5.5 earthquake struck Placerville May 11, 2024, followed by a magnitude 5.2 aftershock early Friday May 12, both with epicenters near the Lake. Areas marked in purple have moved in the past 1-8 million years, in purple during the past 100,000 years and in orange during the past 11-203 years. California Geological Survey
