

Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC)

The Plumas County Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) is seeking individuals who are interested in volunteering to apply for open positions under the purview of the council.

Positions are available in a subcommittee tasked with developing a plan to provide services for youth who were previously eligible to be committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice.

Subcommittee members must be individuals who have experience providing community-based youth services, youth justice advocates with expertise and knowledge of the juvenile justice system, or have been directly involved in the juvenile justice system.

Detailed information can be found in the California Welfare and Institutions Code within Sections 1990, 1991, and 1995.

Additionally, positions are available on the JJCC for nonprofit community-based organizations with experience providing services to minors.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The JJCC is a multiagency council responsible for the development and implementation of a continuum of county-based responses to juvenile crime. The coordinating council includes the chief probation officer, as chair, and one representative each from the district attorney's office, Plumas County contract public defender attorneys, the sheriff's department, the board of supervisors, the department of social services, the department of behavioral health, a community-based drug and alcohol program, the county office of education or a school district, a juvenile court representative, at-large community representatives, and representatives from nonprofit community-based organizations providing services to minors.
