Installation of Trauma Kits in Portola schools

In response to recent full-scale active shooter exercise at local high schools, a collaborative effort is underway to install trauma kits in schools across the county. This project, led by Plumas County Public Health Agency, with local hospitals (Eastern Plumas Health Care District, Plumas District Hospital, and Seneca Healthcare District) purchasing the kits, local schools including Plumas Unified School District, and local EMS (EPHC Ambulance, Careflight/REMSA, and Peninsula Fire District) assisting with installation and training of school staff. The purpose of the project is to enhance emergency preparedness and improve life-saving capabilities in crisis situations. The trauma kits will be strategically placed in schools and include essential medical supplies to provide immediate care for severe injuries until first responders arrive.

On March 18, 2025, the first of the kits were installed at C. Roy Carmichael and Portola High School, with schools in Quincy, Indian Valley, and Chester areas to be installed by the end of May.
