Missing Person – Request for Public Assistance: Cheryl Taddei

The Plumas County Sheriff's Office is requesting the public's assistance in locating missing person **Cheryl TADDEI**. On November 25, 2025, Cheryl's father reported her missing after not hearing from her for several days, which is unusual for her.

According to information obtained during the investigation, Cheryl and her husband were returning from a trip to the Mendocino County coast on **November 19, 2025**. At approximately **1:30 p.m.**, Cheryl was last seen near the roundabout intersection of **Highway 20 and Highway 407 in Upper Lake, Lake County**, after she exited their vehicle during an argument and did not return. She has not been seen or heard from since.

Cheryl was last known to be carrying a **duffel bag, a backpack, several plastic grocery bags, and accompanied by her tan Chihuahua**. She was reportedly wearing a **t-shirt, blue denim skirt, and black slip-on shoes**. Cheryl has distinctive tattoos, including a **"tiger" on her right shoulder** and multiple tattoos on her right arm depicting a **"spider," a "fairy," and the name "Johnny."** She is **missing all of her upper teeth** and does not have dentures.

Cheryl has ties to **Greenville and Crescent Mills** in Plumas County, and there is concern for her safety and welfare due to the length of time since her last contact with family.

Anyone who has seen Cheryl, recognizes the described tattoos, or has information about her whereabouts is asked to contact the **Plumas County Sheriff's Office Dispatch** at **(530) 283-6300** or their local law enforcement agency. In an emergency, call **911**.
